The preliminary exam is the first and most important stage of three stages of the civil service exam. The preliminary stage consists of two papers:

<b>Paper I</b>	General studies paper I is consist of 100 question of 2 marks each which is to be answered in 2 hrs
<b>Paper II</b>	CSAT The GS II or CSAT intends to check the analytical skills of the IAS aspirants and it is of qualifying nature by 33% . CSAT consist of 80 questons of 2.5 marks each to be answered in 2 hrs
There is <b>penalty</b> marks of <b>1/3<sup>rd</sup></b> of the marks assigned to the wrong attempted question for the both Paper I and Paper II

# CSE MAINS SYLLABUS

## General Studies – I : Indian Heritage and Culture, History and Geography of the World and Society

Indian culture will cover the salient aspects of Art Forms, literature and Architecture from ancient to modern times.

Modern Indian history from about the middle of the eighteenth century until the present- significant events, personalities, issues.

The Freedom Struggle — its various stages and important contributors/contributions from different parts of the country.

Post-independence consolidation and reorganization within the country.

History of the world will include events from 18th century such as industrial revolution, world wars, redrawal of national boundaries, colonization, decolonization, political philosophies like communism, capitalism, socialism etc.— their forms and effect on the society.

Salient features of Indian Society, Diversity of India.

Role of women and women's organization, population and associated issues, poverty and developmental issues, urbanization, their problems and their remedies.

Effects of globalization on Indian society.

Social empowerment, communalism, regionalism & secularism.

Salient features of world's physical geography.

Distribution of key natural resources across the world (including South Asia and the Indian sub-continent); factors responsible for the location of primary, secondary, and tertiary sector industries in various parts of the world (including India).

Important Geophysical phenomena such as earthquakes, Tsunami, Volcanic activity, cyclone etc., geographical features and their location-changes in critical geographical features (including water-bodies and ice-caps) and in flora and fauna and the effects of such changes.

## PAPER – I (ESSAY)

Candidates will be required to write an essay on a specific topic. The choice of subjects will be given. They will be expected to keep closely to the subject of the essay to arrange their ideas in orderly fashion, and to write concisely. Credit will be given for effective and exact expression.

## General Studies – II : Governance, Constitution, Polity, Social Justice and International relations

Indian Constitution – historical underpinnings, evolution, features, amendments, significant provisions and basic structure.

Comparison of the Indian constitutional scheme with that of other countries.

Structure, organization and functioning of the Executive and the Judiciary Ministries and Departments of the Government; pressure groups and formal / informal associations and their role in the Polity.

Functions and responsibilities of the Union and the States, issues and challenges pertaining to the federal structure, devolution of powers and finances up to local levels and challenges therein.

Parliament and State legislatures- structure, functioning, conduct of business, powers & privileges and issues arising out of these.

Separation of powers between various organs dispute redressal mechanisms and institutions.

Salient features of the Representation of People's Act.

Appointment to various Constitutional posts, powers, functions and responsibilities of various Constitutional Bodies.

Statutory, regulatory and various quasi-judicial bodies.

Government policies and interventions for development in various sectors and issues arising out of their design and implementation.

Development processes and the development industry- the role of NGOs, SHGs, various groups and associations, donors, charities, institutional and other stakeholders

Welfare schemes for vulnerable sections of the population by the Centre and States and the performance of these schemes; mechanisms, laws, institutions and Bodies constituted for the protection and betterment of these vulnerable sections.

Issues relating to development and management of Social Sector / Services relating to Health, Education, Human Resources.

Issues relating to poverty and hunger.

Important aspects of governance, transparency and accountability, e-governance- applications, models, successes, limitations, and potential ; citizen's charters, transparency & accountability and institutional and other measures.

Role of civil services in a democracy.

India and its neighborhood-relations.

Bilateral, regional and global groupings and agreements involving India and / or affecting India's interests

Effect of policies and politics of developed and developing countries on India's interests, Indian diaspora.

Important international institutions, agencies and fora- their structure, mandate.

Linkages between development and spread of extremism.

Challenges to internal security through communication networks, role of media and social networking sites in internal security challenges, basics of cyber security; money-laundering and its prevention

Various Security forces and agencies and their mandate.

## General Studies - IV : Ethics, Integrity, and Aptitude

This paper will include questions to test the candidate's attitude and approach to issues relating to integrity, probity in public life and his problem solving approach to various issues and conflicts faced by him in dealing with society. Questions may utilise the case study approach to determine these aspects. The following broad areas will be covered.

Attitude : Content, Structure, function: its influence and relation with thought and behaviour; moral and political attitudes; social influence and persuasion.

Emotional intelligence-concepts, and their utilities and application in administration and governance.

Public/Civil service values and Ethics in Public administration : Status and problem; ethical concerns and dilemmas in government and private institutions; laws, rules, regulations and conscience as sources of ethical guidance; accountability and ethical governance; strengthening of ethical moral values in governance; ethical issues in international relations and funding; corporate governance.

Case Studies on above issues.

Ethics and Human Interface: Essence, determinants and consequences of Ethics in human actions; dimensions of ethics; ethics in private and public relationships, Human Values - lessons from the lives and teachings of great leaders, reformers and administrators; role of family, society and educational institutions in inculcating values.

Aptitude and foundational values for Civil services, integrity, impartiality and non-partisanship, objectivity, dedication to public service, empathy, tolerance and compassion towards the weaker sections.

Contributions of moral thinkers and philosophers from India and world.

Probity in Governance: Concept of public service; Philosophical basis of governance and probity; Information sharing and transparency in government, Right to Information, Codes of Ethics, Codes of Conduct, Citizen's Charters, Work culture, Quality of service delivery, Utilization of public funds, challenges of corruption.

### Interview/Personality Test

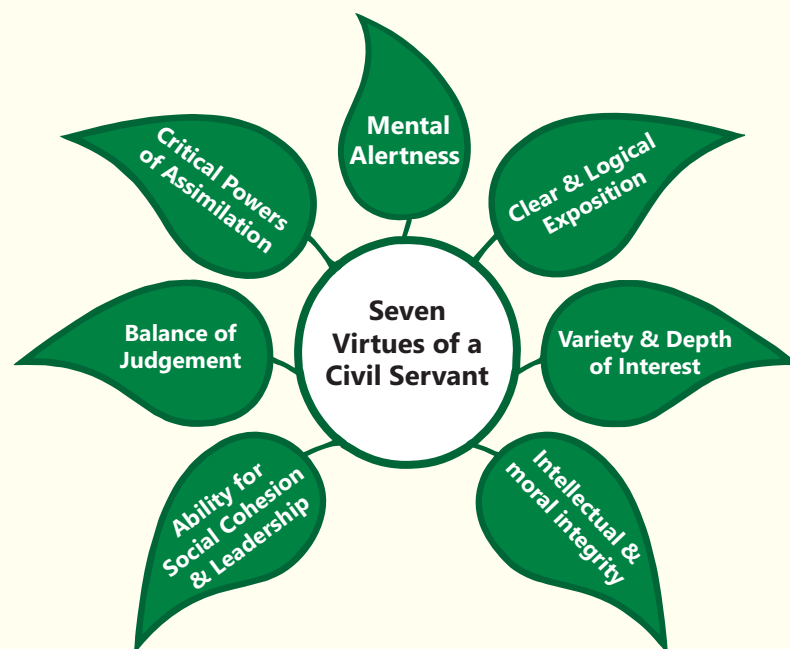
The candidate will be interviewed by a board that will have before it, the record of his career. He /she will be asked questions on matters of general interest. The objective of the interview is to assess the personal suitability of the candidate for a career in public service by a board of competent and unbiased observers.

The test is intended to judge the mental caliber of a candidate. In broad terms, this is an assessment of not only his intellectual qualities but also social traits and his interest in current affairs. Some of the qualities, to be judged are mental alertness, critical power of assimilation, clear and logical exposition, balance of judgement, variety and depth of interest, ability for social cohesion and leadership, intellectual and moral integrity.

The technique of the interview is not that of a strict cross examination but of a natural though directed and purposive conversation which is intended to reveal the mental qualities of the candidate.

The interview test is not intended to be a test of either specialized or general knowledge of the candidates that has been already tested through their written papers. Candidates are expected to take an intelligent interest not only in their special subjects of academic study but also in the events that occur around them both within and outside their own state or country.

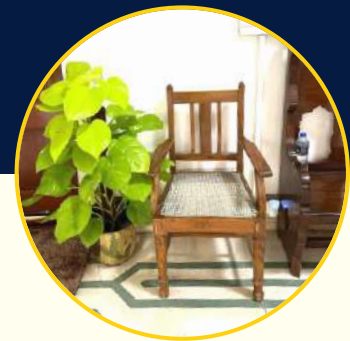

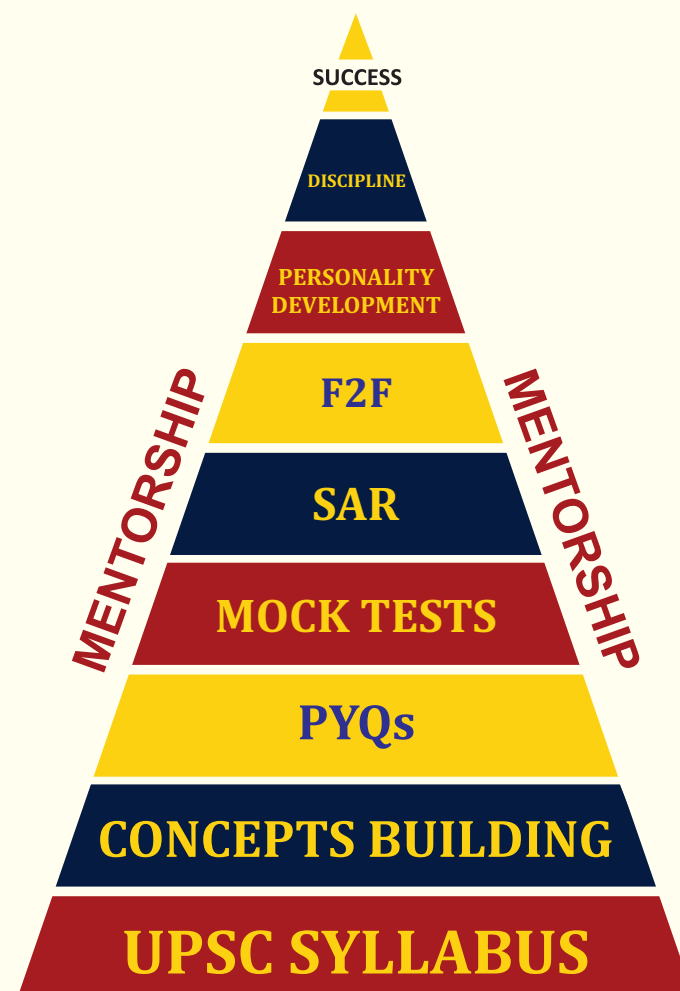
# SUCCESS PYRAMID

- **SYLLABUS** : Aspirants should be thoroughly aware of CSE Syllabus for General Studies (prelims+Mains) and Optional Subject.
- **Concept** : Major focus should be the **concept clarity** of the static portion in History-Culture, Geography, Environment, Polity, Economy, Science & Technology, Ethics. **(Vertical Depth)** (avoiding multiplication of sources, Revision is the key).
- **PYQ's** : At least two-to-three revisions of PYQs, are must especially from 2011 onwards. Solve and try to understand the examiner's mind. Identify major repeated themes and types of errors.
- **Mock Test** : Any number between 15-20 quality mock tests are sufficient, if you have analyzed these tests thoroughly and implemented learning in the following tests. The practice intelligent guesses that you have learned from PYQs.
- **Feedback** : Identify your Strength Subjects (at least two) where you can score with above 80% efficiency and rest you should prepare at above average level.
- **Personality development** : Should be shaped from the beginning of the preparation.
- **Discipline** : Nothing can beat a cool, calm and confident mind on the day of the exam.

# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTION

## Q. Which newspapers should be read?

One or two standard newspapers are sufficient. (The Hindu / Indian Express/Business Standard or Economic Times).

## Q. How to read a newspaper?

Combine the current developments with issues and topics, to determine the relevancy of events. Most of these questions are based on contemporary issues.

Note the key facts of the events, which will be highly beneficial in the preparation.

Note the events in the register according to GS Paper wise, under the headings of National, International, Economy and Ecology and Environment.

Note the key points of important editorial articles that are essential for the Main examination. (specially in Essay)

## Q.I have got only one year time duration for preparation. Can I become an IAS in such a short period of time?

Within, for the preparation of the IAS Exam, one or two years of intensive study is required because the syllabus is very wide and it is also necessary to have an understanding and hold on the subject. However with the right strategy, better guidance and perseverance it can also be done in one year.

Aspirant's family background, academic ability and his basic understanding, play a decisive role if everything is positive and favourable then success can be achieved even in one year through hard work.

## Q. Should we prepare our own Notes?

Nothing could be better than this. However, the problem arises when one considers a wide syllabus, which is too vast if we include two Optional papers and General Studies which in turn comprise subjects. One can decide to pair his own notes in those areas in which one is weak, there are many sources to consult, or on those topics that are very important from the examination point of view. Otherwise, it will be a herculean task to prepare notes on individual topics.

## Q. If I apply for Civil Services Prelims Exam but do not appear in any paper will it be counted as an attempt?

No, an attempt will be counted only if you have appeared in at least one paper.

## Q. If a candidate belongs to a community included in the OBC list of states but not in the Central list of OBCs, is he eligible for age relaxation, reservation, etc. for Civil Services Examinations?

No, only candidates belonging to communities that are included in the Central list of OBC's are eligible for such concessions.

## Q. Can I choose an optional subject (in Mains), which I have not studied during Graduation / PG level?

Yes, you can choose any optional subject from amongst the UPSC's list of optional subjects for Civil Services Main Exam.

## Q. Can I write different papers of Civil Services Main Exam in different languages?

No, you have the option to write your answers either in English or in any one of the languages included in the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution.

## Q. ROLE OF PREVIOUS YEAR PAPERS

Generally, it is advised that the candidates should carefully study the last 10 years question papers of General Studies (Prelims) exam, as these give a fair idea as to how the questions are framed from the respective themes of the syllabus and also indicate the difficulty level.

## Q. Will UPSC deduct marks for bad handwriting?

If a candidate's handwriting is not easily legible, a deduction will be made on this account from the total marks, otherwise accruing to him.

## Q. Will there be minimum qualifying marks for UPSC Interview?

The interview will carry 275 marks (with no minimum qualifying marks).

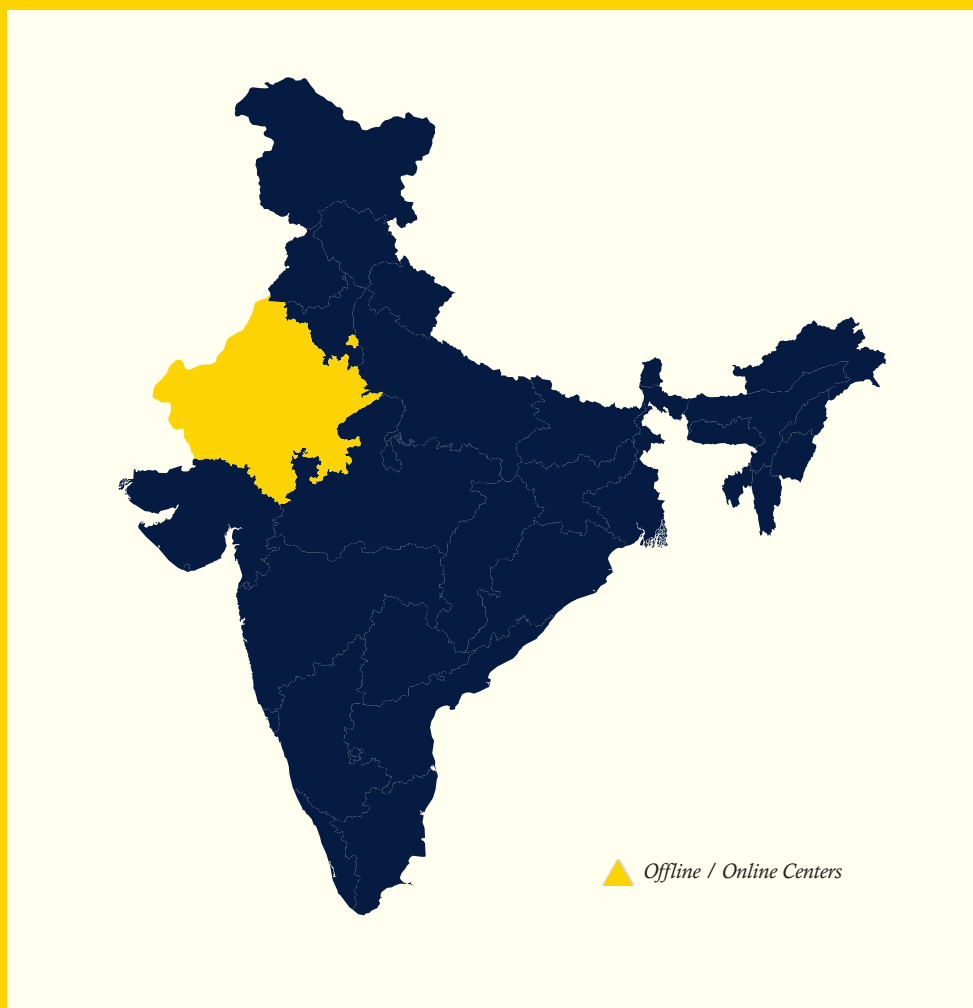
